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**GENERAL PURPOSE**

The Part-Time Maintenance position is responsible for supporting the cleanliness, safety, and overall upkeep of the Roy Recreation Complex and Roy Aquatic Center. This position performs a variety of apprentice-level skilled maintenance tasks and custodial duties to ensure equipment, building systems, and amenities are well-maintained and operating properly. Responsibilities include routine cleaning and sanitization, assisting with basic repairs, and helping maintain a safe and hygienic pool environment through regular monitoring and upkeep. The position also identifies and reports maintenance or safety concerns, contributing to a clean, functional, and welcoming environment for members and staff.

**SUPERVISION RECEIVED**

Works under the general supervision of the Aquatics Maintenance Superintendent.

## SUPERVISION EXERCISED

May provide immediate to close supervision of seasonal or temporary workers.

## ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Perform routine light maintenance tasks such as changing light bulbs, replacing air filters, tightening fixtures, and basic minor repairs.

Maintains city swimming pools; assures proper operation of boiler and heating systems; controls chlorination of swimming water to ensure safe use; assures water purification standards; performs electrical maintenance and repair of restrooms, pavilions

Assists in performing general upkeep and repairs to pool equipment; assures proper system operation for the calibrated release of chemicals into the swimming pool; assists to clean chemical lines and pool.

Operates light equipment such as power washer, miscellaneous power tools, pool cleaning vacuums, etc

Assists in preventive maintenance on facility systems and equipment; maintains HVAC system; maintains boilers, domestic hot water systems and pumps.

General maintenance on various buildings, equipment, and systems, i.e., motors, pumps, valves, bearings, floats, pulleys, belts, switches, relays, plugs, light ballasts, light photocells, fuses, timers, wiring, fire sensors, door hardware, floor and ceiling repair, dry wall, painting, caulking, concrete repair, etc.

Assists in the installation and repair of plumbing piping and fixtures, assists in general carpentry; assists in performing general upkeep and repairs to pool equipment; monitors status of buildings and facilities regarding safety standards; makes recommendations related to the replacement or upgrading of facilities to comply with established safety codes and regulations.

Performs other related duties as assigned to support overall facility operations.
